Seasonal Employment Gains in Government; Uptick in Unemployment Rate to 8.3%

Arizona's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate increased three-tenths of a percentage point from 8.0% in July to 8.3% in August. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.4% in July to 7.3% in August. A year ago in August, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.3% and the U.S. rate was 8.1% (see **Figure 1**).

In August, 39,800 Nonfarm jobs (1.6%) were added to Arizona payrolls (see **Figure 2**). This gain was nearly identical to the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 39,900 jobs. However, it was less than the previous two years where job gains of 59,000 (2012) and 55,000 (2011) were observed in August. Government added the majority of job gains with 32,000 jobs (8.8%). This gain was more than the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 28,600, but less than the two previous years. Government recorded job gains of 41,000 in August 2011 and 40,700 in August



2012. Gains in August are typical as schools resume with new staffing levels at the beginning of the academic year. The Private Sector added 7,800 jobs (0.4%), less than the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 11,400 jobs.

Over the Month Job Gain /Loss by Industry Sector

Six of the eleven major sectors had job gains while five recorded job losses in August (see **Figure 3**).

Government reported the largest job gain in August among the sectors adding 32,000 jobs (8.8%). Government gains in August are typical as schools resume after summer break. Local Government added the majority by gaining 28,600 jobs. Gains in Local Education (29,800 jobs) were slightly offset by losses in non-education related sectors (-1,200 jobs). State Government added 3,100 jobs, all from State Education (3,100 jobs). The Federal Government added 300 jobs.

Education and Health Services (EHS) added 8,000 jobs (2.2%) over the month in August. Most of the gains occurred in Educational Services, which added 4,400 jobs. This gain was slightly higher than the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain (3,900 jobs), but lower than the August gain in the previous three years ('10-'12). Health Care added 2,000 jobs from Ambulatory Health Care Services (800 jobs), Hospitals (700 jobs), and Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (500 jobs). Social Assistance added 1,600 jobs, the highest over-the-month gain since 1990.

Leisure and Hospitality (L&H) gained 2,300 jobs (0.8%) in August. All gains came from Accommodations and Food Services (2,400 jobs) with gains in Food Services and Drinking Places (3,100 jobs) being offset by losses in Accommodation (-700 jobs). Arts, Entertainment and Recreation lost 100 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities (TTU) added 2,000 jobs, twice the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 1,000 jobs in August. The main driver within TTU was Retail which added 2,400 jobs, reflecting back-to-school shopping season. This was the largest August job gain since 2000 and more than three times the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 700 jobs. The majority of these gains came from unreported subsectors within Retail. Wholesale shed 800 jobs. Transportation and Warehousing added 400 jobs, and Utilities was flat over the month.

Financial Activities (FA) added 700 jobs in August. Finance and Insurance added all of the jobs gained over the month (700 jobs) while Real Estate and Rental and Leasing remained flat.


Information added 100 jobs.

Construction shed 1,900 jobs in August which typically ('03-'12 average) gains 200 jobs. This marks only the fifth time Construction has shed jobs in August (2006 & 2008-2010). The prerecession ten-year-average ('98-'07) gain is 1,400 jobs. Heavy Construction was the only subsector to add jobs (300 jobs), both Specialty Trade (-1,800) and Building Construction (-400) shed jobs.

Manufacturing shed 1,800 jobs in August, much higher than the ten-year-average ('03-'12) loss of 100 jobs. Durable Goods shed 1,900 jobs, most of which occurred in unreported sectors (-1,400 jobs). Nondurable Goods added 100 jobs.

Professional and Business Services (PBS) lost 900 jobs in August where the ten-year-average ('03-'12) is a gain of 2,100 jobs. Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services and Management of Companies and Enterprises were flat over the month. Within Administrative and Support and Waste, Services to

Buildings and Dwellings (500 jobs) and Business Support Services (200 jobs) gained while Employment Services shed 1,300 jobs. Employment Services has a ten-year-average gain of 1,500 jobs in August.

Other Services (-600 jobs) and **Natural Resource and Mining** (-100 jobs) shed jobs.

Over the Year Job Gain/Loss by Industry Sector

Total Nonfarm employment increased by 2.0% (48,100 jobs) in August over the same time last year. The Private Sector added 48,700 jobs over the year (2.4%), while Government lost 600 jobs (-0.2%). Eight of the eleven major sectors reported gains and three reported losses (see **Figure 4**).



Education and Health Services gained 11,000 (3.0%) jobs over the year in August. Job gains were recorded in both Health Care and Social Assistance (10,600 jobs) and Educational Services (400 jobs). Health Care gained 8,500 jobs (3.2%), with all subsectors gaining jobs over the year in August. Within Health Care, Ambulatory Health Care Services (6,200 jobs), Nursing and Residential Care Facilities (1,300 jobs), and Hospitals (1,000 jobs) all recorded job gains. Year to date, Ambulatory Health Care Services has averaged 4.0% over-the-year growth, the largest increase since 2008 (5.1%). Social Assistance gained 2,100 jobs (5.1%).

Leisure and Hospitality gained 10,900 jobs (4.1%) over the year in August. Accommodation and Food Services added the majority of these gains, adding 9,400 jobs. Within Accommodation and Food Services, Food Services and Drinking Places accounted for the majority of these gains, adding 9,100 jobs; Accommodation added 300 jobs. Arts, Entertainment and Recreation gained 1,500 jobs (4.4%).

Trade, Transportation and Utilities added 10,000 jobs (2.1%) over the year in August, the largest gain since November 2011. Trade overall gained 10,700 jobs, with both Wholesale Trade (4,800 jobs) and Retail Trade (5,900 jobs) recording job growth. Gains within Retail Trade were primarily attributed to growth in Motor Vehicles and Parts, which added 2,000 jobs. Food and Beverage also gained 1,300 jobs. Transportation and Warehousing (-400 jobs) and Utilities (-300 jobs) both shed jobs. This was the 10th consecutive month of over-the-year losses in Transportation and Warehousing.

Financial Activities added 7,300 jobs (4.1%) in August, the fourth consecutive month of over-the-year growth at or above 4.0%. Finance and Insurance added 4,300 jobs with all subsectors gaining jobs. Job

gains were recorded in Insurance Carriers and Related Activities (2,200 jobs), Credit Intermediation and Related Activities (1,300 jobs), and Securities, Commodity Contracts (800 jobs). Real Estate and Rental and Leasing added 3,000 jobs. Over-the-year growth within Real Estate and Rental and Leasing has been trending upwards from 0.2% in November 2012 to 6.6% in August 2013.

Construction reported an over-the-year job gain of 5,600 jobs (4.7%) in August. This comes after an upward revision to the July 2013 job estimate (9,100 jobs revised from 8,200 jobs). The majority of these August over-the-year job gains were recorded in Specialty Trades (5,000 jobs). Heavy Construction gained 800 jobs. Building Construction (-200 jobs) recorded its first over-the-year loss since June 2012.

Professional and Business Services gained 4,400 jobs (1.2%) over the year in August. Professional, Scientific and Technical Services recorded a majority of these gains (3,600 jobs). Administrative and Support and Waste gained 1,500 jobs, despite large losses within Employment Services (-6,600 jobs). Management of Companies and Enterprises lost 700 jobs.

Information (1,500 jobs) and **Natural Resource and Mining** (300 jobs), both added jobs over the year in August.

Manufacturing recorded the largest August over-the-year loss, shedding 1,200 jobs. Durable Goods lost 1,700 jobs, the largest over-the-year loss since October 2010. Nondurable Goods gained 500 jobs. **Other Services** shed 1,100 jobs and **Government** shed 600 jobs.

Summary

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Arizona increased three-tenths of a percentage point from 8.0% in July to 8.3% in August. The U.S. seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dropped one-tenth of a percentage point from 7.4% in July to 7.3% in August. A year ago, the Arizona seasonally adjusted rate was 8.3% and the U.S. rate was 8.1% (see **Figure 1**).


In August, 39,800 Nonfarm jobs (1.6%) were added to Arizona's payrolls. This gain was nearly identical to the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 39,900 jobs, but less than the two previous years which recorded August gains of 55,000 in 2011 and 59,000 in 2012. Government added the majority of gains with 32,000 jobs (8.8%) added. This gain was more than the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 28,600, but less than the two previous years which recorded gains of 41,000 jobs (2011) and 40,700 jobs (2012) respectively. Gains in August are typical as schools resume with new staffing levels at the beginning of the academic year. The Private Sector added 7,800 jobs (0.4%), less than the ten-year-average ('03-'12) gain of 11,400 jobs.

Six of the eleven major sectors had gains while five recorded losses. Government reported the largest gain of 32,000 jobs (8.8%) in August. 
Total Nonfarm employment increased by 2.0% (48,100 jobs) in August over the same time last year. The Private Sector added 48,700 jobs over the year (2.4%), while Government lost 600 jobs (-0.2%). Eight of the eleven major sectors reported gains with three reporting losses. Educational and Health Services reported the largest over-the-year gain of 11,000 jobs (3.0%), followed by Leisure and Hospitality (10,900 jobs) and Trade, Transportation and Utilities (10,000 jobs) sectors. Other major sectors reporting gains include: Financial Activities (7,300 jobs); Construction (5,600 jobs); Professional and Business Services (4,400 jobs); Information (1,500 jobs); and Natural Resource and Mining (300 jobs). Manufacturing (-1,200 jobs), Other Services (-1,100 jobs) and Government (-600 jobs) all lost jobs over the year.

Seasonally Adjusted**




**Arizona & U.S. Nonfarm Employment

Year-to-Year Percent Change**




**Arizona & U.S. Manufacturing Employment
Year-to-Year Percent Change**






**Arizona & U.S. Retail Trade
